Man: Good morning. Can I help you?

Rob: I'm not feeling very well. I think I have the flu.

Man: What are your symptoms?

Rob: I have a headache and a cough.

Man: Do you have a temperature?

Rob: No, I don't think so.

Man: Are you allergic to any drugs?

Rob: I'm allergic to penicillin.

Man: No problem. This is ibuprofen. It'll make you feel better.

Rob: How many do I have to take?

Man: Two every four hours.

Rob: Sorry. How often?

Man: Two every four hours. If you don't feel better in 48 hours, you should see a doctor.

Rob: Okay thanks. How much is that?

Man: It's 6.99 please.

Rob: Thank you.
